Governor Phil Murphy recently signed bill NJ A-5015, which requires school districts to provide instruction on grief as part of the New Jersey Student Learning Standards in Comprehensive Health and Physical Education. Under the bill, New Jersey's public schools will be required to provide instruction for students in grades 8 through 12, on, at a minimum, the physical, emotional, and behavioral symptoms of grief; coping mechanisms and techniques for handling grief and loss; and resources available to students, including in-school support, mental health crisis support, and individual and group therapy.

The grief specialists at the Joseph T. Quinlan Bereavement Center have developed a program that addresses the requirements of the the new bill while teaching school communities the skills needed to present these subjects to students.
